<p>Agro-ecological farming</p>		<p>Supporting system changes on the farm towards agroecological farming practices which consider the triple bottom line of Environment, Community and Economy</p>
<p>Regenerating Soils</p>		<p>'Projects to improve soil health through a diverse range of activities - as part of a whole farm transition, or as 'Try before you buy' activities to test new approaches before committing further</p>
<p>Wildlife Rich Habitats</p>		<p>Supporting projects to improve existing habitats on farms, create new habitats and integrate improved habitats into productive farm activities</p>
<p>Peatland Restoration</p>		<p>Supporting projects to restore ecologically functioning peatlands by restoring hydrological function and conditions for sphagnum mosses to develop laying down more peat.</p>
<p>Taste the Landscape</p>		<p>Linking sustainable farm business and its produce with the landscape and culture - sense of place through supporting a local food culture - many activities under this category would need to be integrated with other Nature, Climate and People activities</p>
<p>Farming for All</p>		<p>Connecting farms with people and people with farms. Improving access, providing new access, education visits, events on the farm, bringing volunteers onto the farm, Health & Wellbeing, therapy barns, green social prescribing</p>
<p>Championing Heritage</p>		<p>Protecting, enhancing and interpreting historic features within Cornwall National Landscape</p>
<p>Farming Pioneers</p>		<p>Projects demonstrating genuine innovation either through new or novel practices, or making change at scale or working with other businesses</p>
<p>Water Quality</p>		<p>Projects to reduce agricultural pollutants entering waterways and water bodies.</p>
